



### 1. BBA (Bachelor of Business Administration)

The degree shall be titled as Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) under the Faculty of Commerce and Management. The implementation of Choice Based Credit System.

### **Eligibility:**

• A candidate from any stream, should have passed 12th Std. Examination (H.S.C.10+2) with minimum 40% of marks and English as a passing subject.

OR

• Three Years Diploma Course from Board of Technical Education, conducted by Government of Maharashtra or its equivalent, after S.S.C. i.e. 10thStandard.

OR

• Two Years Diploma Course in Pharmacy from Board of Technical Education, conducted by Government of Maharashtra or its equivalent, after H.S.C. i.e. 12th Standard.

OR

• Completed MCVC program

### **Duration of the Programme:**

The Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) is a full time three (3) years programme and it is divided in six (6) Semesters.

- National Service Scheme (NSS) is beneficial to both students as well as the society in various different means. NSS helps the student to grow individually and also as a group. It makes the students confident, develop leadership skills, and gain knowledge about different aspects of the society.
- The Motto or watchword of the National Service Scheme if "Not Me But You". NSS volunteers generally work in villages, slums and voluntary agencies to complete 120 hours of regular activities during an academic year.
- As per the fundamental principles of National Service Scheme, a volunteer is expected to remain in constant touch with the community. There are two types of NSS activities: Regular Activities (120 hours) and Annual Special Camp (120 hours).
- All the NSS Volunteers who have served NSS for at least 2 years and have performed 240 hours
  of work under NSS are entitled to a certificate from the university under the signature of the ViceChancellor.

### Language Lab
