A) Appointment of the Coordinator:

B) Registration of the students in the Cell:

The students from all classes are then registered to respective cells as per their wish and ability to excel.

C) Planning:

Standard operating procedures (SOPs) are prepared for each cell. Every Cell has some predefined objectives. Every cell / department prepares annual colander to achieve the set goals/ objectives. The plan of the activities is prepared and approved by the Principal. An annual budget for these cell is also dedicated to function smoothly and achieve the targets set.

Execution:

At the start of every academic year, the Cell coordinator conducts a session for all the registered students. Throughout the year several expert lectures and workshops and competitions are organized related to respective cells. Sports meet, intercollegiate multi event completion – UDAAN, different competitions in cultural fest. Sessions on time management. Stress management writing answer etc are conducted throughout year.

Best Practice II

Title: Student Research Project Scheme(SRPS)

Objectives:

- 1. To create awareness of research among the students
- 2. To make students well acquainted with importance and opportunities involved in the research work
- 3. To inculcate the research culture in institutes and among the students
- 4. To identify young talent, build capacity, promote innovation and support inter- disciplinary research in collaboration with faculties

Context:

As the educational landscape evolves, research emerges as a cornerstone of academic curricula, bridging theory and practice to enhance understanding and drive societal progress. Integrating research into teaching methods is crucial, fostering deep learning and expertise. Research, inherently iterative, fuels an endless pursuit of knowledge. Initiatives like the "STUDENT RESEARCH PROJECT SCHEME (SRPS)" have surfaced, where students conduct research under faculty guidance, aiming to publish in reputable journals. SRPS aims to cultivate a research culture, focusing on solution-driven projects benefiting local communities. This scheme not only fosters students' holistic development but also cultivates critical thinking skills, positioning them as contributors to society's advancement.

Various challenges faced during execution of this activity like Encouraging student participation through motivation, Fostering student interest in research endeavors, Sustaining student motivation through ongoing follow-up, Enhancing students' presentation skills.

Practice:

Research is an essential component of higher education which helps in search of truth, gain insights for creating new knowledge, imparts excitement and dynamism in educational process and facilitates intellectual growth. Defining its scope would be setting boundaries or limiting oneself for his research work. Hence, this SRPS with a multi - disciplinary approach would bring the students from different areas together with the common purpose of evolving new theories, methodologies and frameworks. It would definitely create an appropriate research environment for the institutes of AEF-HE, its students and so for the faculties to equip and undertake the quality research and attain excellence. This will also promote an action-oriented research and high impact research among motivated faculties from diverse disciplines focusing on issues and problems having some social relevance. Further that help to streate a network of eminent researchers in identified thrust areas.

- 4. To give students an opportunity to sharpen their communication skills, patience level and present their research idea with confidence

D) Limitations:

- 1. **Time management:** Many students find it hard to cope with their academic studies & competitive entrance exam preparations while also devoting themselves to a SRPS which required 3 to 4-month dedication.
- 2. Project coordination: Conflicts and disputes often occur at various stages of a competition amongst group members.

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Evidence of Success:

- 1. Inculcate research culture among students.
- 2. Presentation of Research Project confidently.
- 3. Understanding research paper format & writing paper as per format.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Problem Encountered

- 1. Create interest about research among students and motivate for the participation
- 2. Taking follow up of students by keeping their motivation up.
- 3. Time Constraint-Balancing research commitments with academic coursework and other responsibilities can be difficult for students
- 4. Research topic Selection-Students may struggle to identify suitable research topics aligned with their interests and expertise, leading to delays in project initiation
- 5. Project Coordination- Conflicts and disputes often occur at various stages of a competition amongst group members.
- 6. Presentation and publication of research work

Resources Required:

- 1. Training: Organizing workshops or seminars on research methodologies, data analysis technique, and presentation skills.
- 2. Project coordination: Conflicts and disputes often occur at various stages of a competition amongst group members.
- 3. Research Facilities: Access to, library books, computer lab and other facilitate for the research work.
- 4. Publication Support: Assistance with manuscript preparation, editing, and submission to peerreviewed journals can help students navigate the publication process.

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
